### MISSION

Booker High School will establish an environment, including unique programs offering opportunities to a diverse population, which enables all students to become critical thinkers and develop skills and values for maximizing their potential.

### VISION

100% of Booker High School students will graduate college or career ready and become productive members of our society.

**BOOKER HIGH SCHOOL** is located on the north end of Sarasota County, and the new \$58 million campus was opened in the winter of 2013. The campus is replete with state-of-the-art classrooms and studios, technology and science labs, and athletic facilities, along with a professional-quality theatre.

- The Booker High School Visual and Performing Arts (VPA) magnet program attracts students from around Sarasota, Manatee and Charlotte counties, providing rigorous pre-professional instruction in dance, digital film and motion design, music, theatre, and visual art.
- The VPA season includes more than a dozen events on the main stage and art studios, earning the program district-wide acclaim.
- Booker High School provides students with rigorous academic classes through the Cambridge University AICE (Advanced International Certificate of Education) program.
- AICE offers a comprehensive college-preparatory curriculum and the opportunity to earn college credit in high school through mastery of AICE exams.
- Students may also elect to take Advanced Placement or on-campus Dual Enrollment courses.
- The JROTC program at Booker High School offers training in leadership, accountability, teamwork and logistics.
- The CTE (Career and Technical Education) program at Booker offers courses in digital design, hospitality and tourism, business and entrepreneurship, and engineering and robotics.
- The Law Academy, part of the CTE cluster, offers two tracks: criminal justice and constitutional law, earning students industry certifications before high school graduation.

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# SIGNATURE PROGRAMS

## VISUAL PERFORMING ARTS PROGRAM (VPA)

- Renowned program that provides highly specialized and intensive training for students who possess special talents in and passion for the visual and performing arts area of *dance, digital film and motion design, music, theatre* (performance and technical), and *visual arts*.
- Students spend 3 periods per day in VPA programming, earning 12 credits in their arts discipline by graduation.
- VPA faculty are *also* practicing professionals in their fields, with celebrated local, national and international careers.
- VPA classes are offered in state-of-the-art studios.
- Performances are held in a professional theater facility.
- Many graduates continue their art study at prestigious institutions such as Columbia University, Northwestern University, The Juilliard School, Boston Conservatory, Ringling College of Art + Design, often with sizable scholarships.
- *Notable alumni include American Idol Finalist and Broadway star Syesha Mercado, NBC's Chicago Fire star Charlie Barnett, and Oscar winning makeup artist Bill Corso.*

## CAMBRIDGE ADVANCED INTERNATIONAL CERTIFICATE OF EDUCATION (AICE)

- AICE courses provide students with rigorous, internationally recognized pre-university curriculum which emphasizes the value of broad and balanced study.
- *400+ students participate in Booker High's AICE program.*
- Students who complete AICE courses and receive a passing score on the end of course exam can earn college credits from more than 450 colleges in the US.
- Booker High students perform at exemplary levels in the AICE General Paper and AICE Literature courses, with passing rates of 94% and 100% respectively.
- A Booker High student received the highest score on the AICE Literature Exam in Sarasota County and the second highest in the nation.

# ATHLETICS

Booker High School offers its students opportunities to compete in multiple sports at both the junior varsity and varsity levels. Our students challenge teams from the local area, their FHSAA district and teams from throughout the state. *Booker High School athletic programs are supported by state of the art equipment and facilities that include a gymnasium, training room, four general purpose locker rooms, three in-season sport locker rooms, a professional track, rubber tennis courts and a football stadium.* Over 325 students participate on the following athletic teams:

## LAW ACADEMY

- The Sarasota County Bar Association and local law enforcement professionals provide students with curriculum materials, real world experiences and expertise.
- *An on-campus mock courtroom is set up to simulate a real courtroom, allowing students to apply their knowledge and skills through mock trials.*

## JROTC

- Promotes the study of ethics, citizenship, communications, leadership, life skills and other subjects designed to prepare young men and woman to take their place in adult society.
- Student-centered curriculum focuses on character building and civic responsibility.
- *230 Booker High School students participated in the JROTC program in the 2016-17 school year.*

## CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION (CTE)

- CTE classes are aligned to four career pathways: *Engineering, Hospitality & Tourism, Digital Design, and Business Management & Analysis.*
- Over 110 students have passed certifications in Adobe Photoshop, Microsoft Office (Word, Excel, and PowerPoint), ServSafe, Pre-Engineering, and Robotics.
