- Must possess a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale
- Must have demonstrated leadership abilities through participation in community service, extracurricular or other activities
- Must attach a recent photo to application, copy of high school transcript, financial aid forms and all other supporting documents

REFERENCES

- Must provide three (3) letters of recommendation from non-family members with at least one from your school. Letters must include addresses and telephone numbers of persons providing the reference.

INTERVIEW

- Must meet with the Scholarship Committee at agreed interview time prior to final award
